REPORTS AND COMMENTS

MAYOR JENSEN advised he would be working with the Council President to call a Special Meeting next week, Monday, December 4, 2024, as some Council Members will be out at the Regular Meeting on December 11, 2023. He said the Special Meeting would be to have first or second readings on upcoming legislation in case more two or more Council Members should be absent at a subsequent meeting in December.

COUNCIL MEMBERS:

MRS. DEMALINE, WARD 1, advised she was looking forward to the Tree Lighting event this Saturday, December 2, 2023. She said it is a great event that the City and the French Creek Foundation put on.

MRS. HOLTZMEIER, AT LARGE, advised she has been traveling a lot lately to other cities and communities around the country and when she is in other places, she tends to look around to see what is happening. She said it is really nice to come home and see how well put together the City of Avon is and how prepared they are for the holidays. Mrs. Holtzmeier stated the City was looking really nice around town and that is not only evident to those of us who live here, but those of us that come visit as well.

MR. MCBRIDE, WARD 2, gave kudos to the Mayor and the Administration and the Service Department and all those who helped decorate the City for the holidays.

MR. MOORE, WARD 3, gave kudos to the City on the leaf pickup this season. He said they did a good job on getting those leaves off the tree lawns throughout the City.

MR. RADCLIFFE, WARD 4, asked for clarification when the last leaf pickup is planned for.

Mayor Jensen advised they would be picking them up the rest of this week and probably all of next week and then it would be on an as needed basis. He said they will usually cut off leaf collection by the end of November but will leave one vehicle available as needed. Mayor Jensen clarified that was the plan unless the weather changes and snow stays on the ground. He stated even after the first snowfall in December they will try to make every effort to pick up the leaves.

Mr. Radcliffe said with the nice day this past weekend there were a lot of residents out raking the last bit of their leaves to the curb. He thanked Mayor Jensen for the clarification and said the work is appreciated by the residents.

Mayor Jensen advised Council is a big reason why they can do what they do because some of the equipment that Council has authorized to purchase makes it so much easier for leaf pickup. He said years ago they had to have a crew member physically walking along and swinging the suction hose to get the leaves collected and now they have equipment where you can control that action from inside the vehicle like a video game controller. Mayor Jensen stated the credit should be attributed to Council allowing them to buy the equipment they need and that gives them the advantage as well as having the right employees in place. He advised there is a Parks Maintenance employee who really enjoys helping and overseeing the holiday lighting and Mr. Aaron Crane does a great job and takes it personally and there were some surprises in store for the Tree Lighting event this year and he takes a lot of pride in his work. Mayor Jensen thanked Council for allowing the City to purchase those items.

MR. FISCHER, AT LARGE, thanked Aaron Crane and his crew in the Parks Department for the work getting ready for the Tree Lighting. He texted Mayor Jensen on Friday letting him know how great the holiday lights looked throughout the City. Mr. Fischer said Mayor Jensen let him know that the Parks Department takes great pride in preparing everything for the City for the holidays and that was great to hear. He gave a shout out to Mr. Streater and the Parks Department and said it looks fantastic.

Mr. Streater said he would pass that along and said the crews have done a great job at all our City buildings and properties and they take great pride in their work.
