

## RESOLUTION NO. R-15-21

### **A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR, PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE SECTION 5705.03, CERTIFY TO THE CITY OF AVON THE TOTAL CURRENT TAX VALUATION OF THE CITY OF AVON HAVING TERRITORY LOCATED IN LORAIN COUNTY AND THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF REVENUE THAT WOULD BE GENERATED BY A ONE-HALF (.50) MILL RENEWAL LEVY FOR THE AVON POLICE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, the Police Renewal Levy was passed by voters on November 8, 2016 and will expire in duplicate year 2021, the last collection year being calendar year 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, in order to continue to keep the Police Department properly equipped, a one-half (.50) mill renewal levy is needed to be placed on the November 2, 2021 ballot to maintain motor vehicles, communications equipment, buildings and other infrastructure used directly in the operation of said Police Department; and

**WHEREAS**, said levy would be a renewal for a period of five (5) years beginning in the duplicate year 2022, with the first collection being 2023.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AVON, COUNTY OF LORAIN AND STATE OF OHIO:**

Section 1 – That it is necessary, before authorizing a levy which is in excess of the Ten Mill limit, that the County Auditor, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.03 certify to the City of Avon the total current tax valuation of the City of Avon that has territory located in Lorain County and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by a .50 mill renewal levy for the purpose of providing for the maintenance of motor vehicles, communications equipment, buildings and other infrastructure used directly in the operation of said Police Department pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.19(J). Said tax shall be levied upon the entire territory of the Subdivision (City of Avon) and be placed on the ballot at the November 2, 2021 election. Said ballot measure shall be submitted to the entire territory of the Subdivision (City of Avon). Such levy will be placed upon the tax list and duplicate for the current year beginning in the duplicate year 2022, with the first collection being 2023, if a majority of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof for five (5) years.

Section 2 – That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Auditor of Lorain County.

Section 3 - That Resolution R-13-21 is hereby repealed.

Section 4 – That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Resolution R-15-21 (Con't.)

Section 5 – That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Avon, the immediate emergency being the necessity for the County Auditor to certify to the City of Avon the total current tax valuation of the City that has territory located in Lorain County and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by a .50 mill renewal levy for the maintenance of motor vehicles, communications equipment, buildings and other infrastructure used directly in the operation of said Police Department in sufficient time to place the levy on the ballot for the November 2, 2021 election and repeal Res. R-13-21; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by this Council and approval by the Mayor.
