

**ORDINANCE NO. 101-21**

**AN ORDINANCE TO ACCEPT THE TENTATIVE AGREEMENT REACHED  
IN THE MATTER OF THE CITY OF AVON AND THE  
FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE / OHIO LABOR COUNCIL, INC.  
(DISPATCHERS; SERB CASE NUMBER 2021-MED-09-1083)  
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Avon, Ohio, (public employer) and the Fraternal Order of Police / Ohio Labor Council, Inc., representing full-time Dispatchers (Union), reached a preliminary tentative agreement settling the terms of a wage re-opener for years 2022 and 2023 on December 1, 2021, under the provisions of Chapter 4117 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC); and

**WHEREAS**, the Union ratified the preliminary tentative agreement under the provisions of ORC §4117.10 on or about December 1, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to ORC §4117.10, the public employer has notified the Clerk of Council of the tentative agreement on December 2, 2021, and thereafter submitted the tentative agreement to City Council, as the legislative body, at a Special Meeting called on December 6, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to ORC §4117.10 (B), the legislative body must approve or reject the submission as a whole, and the submission is deemed approved if the legislative body fails to act within thirty (30) days after the public employer submits the agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, upon review, the administration and the legislative body have determined the tentative agreement to be acceptable as a whole in consideration of the interests of the City of Avon and the interest and welfare of the public. Furthermore, acceptance of the tentative agreement is acceptance only as to specified wages, hours, terms and other conditions of employment for bargaining unit employees, and shall not be construed to establish fixed staffing levels nor require specific departmental funding requirements.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AVON, LORAIN COUNTY, OHIO:**

Section 1 - That the Council of the City of Avon hereby accepts the tentative agreement reached between the parties. Further, the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the City of Avon the final document reflecting this agreement. ([See attached](#))

Section 2 - That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Ordinance No. 101-21 (Con't.)

Section 3 - This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of peace, health, and safety in the City of Avon and for the further reason that action is necessary within thirty (30) days of the submission of the tentative agreement consistent with the provisions of ORC §4117.10 (B); therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by this Council and approval by the Mayor.
